Vehicle response order

SECTION 1: Fire

1. Structure Fires

- a. 602 – Class A Engine
- b. 633 and 634 - 6-Tanker and 6-Tanker 2
- c. 661 – 6 Equipment
- d. 651 – 6 Ambulance
- e. 611 – 6 Mini Pumper
- f. 682 and 682 – 6 Wildfire and 6 Wildfire 2

SECTION 2: EMS Call

1. EMS Calls

- a. 651 – 6 Ambulance
- b. Additional units upon request of 651 personal only

SECTION 3: Personal Injury Accident (Auto and/or ORV)

1. Personal injury accident –Vehicle

- a. 651 – 6 Ambulance
- b. 661 – 6 Equipment
- c. 602 – Class A Engine
- d. Additional units upon request of command officer

2. Snowmobile

- a. 651 – 6 Ambulance
- b. 652 – 6 Snowmobile
- c. 661 – 6 Equipment

- d. 602 – Class A Engine
- e. Additional units upon request of command officer

SECTION 4: Wildfire

1. Wildfires

- a. 682 and 682 – 6 Wildfire and 6 Wildfire 2
- b. 633 and 634 - 6-Tanker and 6-Tanker 2
- c. 602 – Class A Engine
- d. Additional units upon request of command officer

SECTION 5: Investigation

- 1. dependent on the type of call but the first unit out should be either:
 - a. 602 – Class A Engine or 651 – 6 Ambulance
 - b. Other units may be required dependent of what is being investigated and shall be designated by the officer in command

SECTION 6: Storm and power line down

1. Storms

- a. All personal respond to station for officer determination of units dispatched and locations.
- b. If no officer is present the following guidelines may be used:
 - i. 602 – Hagni and Myers
 - ii. 633 – Twin Lakes Road and Wheeler Lake Road
 - iii. 634 – County Road 571 and Covert
 - iv. 651 – Stays at Station
 - v. 661 – County Road 612 east of Grass lake Road on top of hill
 - vi. 611 – Stay at Station
 - vii. 681 and 682 – Stay at station

2. Power lines

- a. 611 – 6 Mini Pumper
- b. 661 – 6 Equipment
- c. Additional units upon request of command officer

SECTION 7: General

- 1. 602, 633, and 634 shall not leave paved public streets unless directed to do so by the officer in command=

SECTION 8: Personal minimum requirements by unit

To drive a fire department vehicle you must be certified driver for a fire call. A certified driver is one that is authorized by the chief of the department to drive fire department vehicles.

- 1. 602 – Class A Engine - Two People Required
 - a. Two FF1
- 2. 611 – Mini Pumper - Rescue
 - a. Two FF1 one being a certified driver – For Fires
 - b. For use as a rescue One MFR or EMT
- 3. 633 - Tanker
 - a. One certified driver
- 4. 634 - Tanker
 - a. One certified driver
- 5. 651 – Ambulance -Two People Required
 - a. One EMT
 - b. One MFR or EMT
- 6. 652 - Snowmobile
 - a. One department certified personal for bringing unit to scene
- 7. 661 – Equipment Unit
 - a. One certified driver

8. 681 - Wildfire Unit
 - a. One FF1
9. 682 – Wildfire Unit
 - a. One FF1
