FROM MEMORIAL DAY TO LABOR DAY

Per section (4) of Coldsprings Township Ordinance #1 of 2001(condensed), **NO PERSON SHALL:**

- (a) Construct, place, or maintain a dock, hoist or mooring device on a road ending or public access site
- (b) Anchor, beach or moor an unattended boat on a road ending or public access site (which includes the ground under the water to the center of the lake - riparian rights) for more than 5 consecutive hours except as otherwise provided for in the ordinance.
- (c) Cause or create any loud noises including but not limited to:
 - (1) Playing or using a radio, CD Player or Tape Player, Musical Instrument, Sound Amplifier or other electronic or mechanical sound producing device in such a manner or with such volume as to disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of a reasonable person of normal sensitivities.
 - (2) Yelling, shouting, hooting, singing or making other loud noises.
 - (3) Sounding or using any horn, siren, whistle, bell, or other warning device on a boat so as to disturb the quiet or repose of another person, except as authorized by state law.
- (d) Cause littering on the road ending, public access site or adjoining private property.
- (e) Trespass on adjoining property.
- (f) Interfere with the use and enjoyment of shoreline properties.
- (g) Create any other nuisance situation.
- (h) Drive or back a trailer into the water for the purpose of launching a boat in the lake or river, unless the Township designates that road ending or public access site as an official boat launching site.
- (i) Start, use or maintain a campfire, bonfire, or other recreational fire on a road ending or access site.
- (j) Remain on a road ending or public access site after being requested by a police officer to leave that road ending or public access site
- (k) Picnic, sunbathe or lounge on any public access site or road ending at any time.
- (l) Pump or otherwise remove water from a lake or river at a road ending or public access site, except for fire suppression or training purposes.

Any person who violates any provision of the above shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction (or possible misdemeanor) as defined in Public Act 12 of 1994, amending Public Act 236 of 1961, being sections 600.101-600-9939 or MCLA.

Further, absolutely no additions or improvements, placement of personal property, trash or refuse, lawn mowing, weed removal, or tree trimming shall be done to this property without the express written permission of the Township Supervisor acting on behalf of the Coldsprings Township Board.
